Banquet Chairs – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

NPS Banquet Chairs are built to last, and with a little care, they'll stay strong and clean for years.

Here are a few tips:

- Make sure chairs are fully dry before storing to prevent mold and rust.
- Store in a cool, dry place to avoid moisture and extreme temperatures.
- For long-term storage, cover chairs with dust covers or wrap them in plastic to protect from dust and grime.
- Periodically lubricate hinges and joints to keep them opening and closing smoothly.
- Regularly inspect stored chairs to ensure they remain in good condition, free from moisture or pests.
- Keep the relative humidity between 30% and 40% to help preserve the chairs.
- Protect chairs from prolonged direct sunlight and extreme temperatures to maintain their pristine condition.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

Start by vacuuming the upholstery to get rid of loose dirt and dust. Use a soft brush attachment or handheld vacuum with a brush nozzle for gentle, effective cleaning.

STAIN REMOVAL

For a deeper clean, lightly dampen a sponge or microfiber cloth with cleaning solution—make sure it's not too wet. Wipe each area in small sections, being careful to avoid metal parts like buttons and frame legs to prevent rust.

DRYING

Use a towel or dry cloth to thoroughly dry the chairs, helping to avoid water spots and rust. Let the chairs air dry completely in a well-ventilated spot before storing or using.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid abrasive cleaners and steel wool, as these can scratch and damage the metal surfaces.



Vinyl Upholstery

KEEP IT SIMPLE

Dip a soft cloth or sponge in warm, soapy water and gently scrub the vinyl upholstery, focusing on stains or soiled spots. Avoid soaking the vinyl, as it's sensitive to excess water.

STAIN REMOVAL

For tough stains, mix baking soda and water into a paste. Apply to the stain, then gently scrub with a soft brush or cloth.

DRYING

Pat the vinyl dry with a towel. To keep it from drying out or cracking, consider using a vinyl conditioner or protectant.

WHAT TO AVOID

Skip heat sources like hair dryers, as too much heat can damage vinyl.
