Go Series Chairs – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

NPS Go Series Chairs are designed for durability, and a little care will help them stay in top shape for years. Here are some tips:

- Make sure chairs are fully dry before storing to prevent mold and rust.
- Store in a cool, dry place to avoid moisture and extreme temperatures.
- For long-term storage, use dust covers or wrap chairs in plastic to protect them from dust and grime.
- Lubricate hinges and joints occasionally to keep them opening and closing smoothly.
- Check on stored chairs regularly to ensure they remain in good condition, free from moisture or pests.
- Maintain a relative humidity level of 30% to 40% in the storage area to help preserve the chairs.
- Protect chairs from prolonged sunlight and extreme temperatures to keep them in top condition.



STEEL

CLEANING

Dip a soft cloth or sponge in warm, soapy water, wring it out, and wipe down the chair, including the seat, backrest, and legs.

STAIN REMOVAL

For stubborn spots, gently scrub with a soft-bristle brush. To prevent rust, apply a thin layer of car wax or metal protectant to any steel parts for extra moisture protection.

DRYING

Use a towel to thoroughly dry the chairs, preventing water spots and rust. Let them air dry completely in a well-ventilated area before storing or using.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid abrasive cleaners or steel wool, as they can scratch and damage the steel surface.



VINYL UPHOLSTERY

CLEANING

Dip a soft cloth or sponge in warm, soapy water and gently scrub the vinyl upholstery, focusing on any stains or dirt. Avoid using too much water, as vinyl is sensitive to moisture.

STAIN REMOVAL

For tough stains, make a paste with baking soda and water. Apply it to the stain and gently scrub with a soft brush or cloth.

DRYING

Pat the vinyl dry with a towel. To keep it from drying out or cracking, consider using a vinyl conditioner or protectant.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid heat sources like hair dryers, as high heat can damage the vinyl.



PLASTIC

CLEANING

Dip a sponge or soft brush in warm, soapy water and scrub the plastic chairs, focusing on any stained or grimy areas.

STAIN REMOVAL

For tough stains or mildew, mix equal parts water and white vinegar. Apply to the stain, let it sit for a few minutes, then scrub and rinse.

DRYING

If possible, let the chairs dry in sunlight to naturally disinfect and freshen the plastic.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid abrasive cleaners like scouring powders or steel wool, as they can scratch and dull the plastic.



FABRIC UPHOLSTERY

CLEANING

Start by vacuuming the upholstery to remove loose dirt and dust. Use a soft brush attachment or handheld vacuum for gentle cleaning.

STAIN REMOVAL

Dampen a sponge or microfiber cloth with a cleaning solution (not too wet) and wipe each area in sections. Avoid metal parts like buttons and frame legs to prevent rust.

DRYING

Thoroughly dry the chairs with a towel to avoid water spots and rust. Let them air dry completely in a well-ventilated area before storing or using.
