Music Chairs – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

NPS Music Chairs are designed for durability, and a little care can keep them in great shape for years. Here are a few tips:

- Make sure chairs are fully dry before storing to prevent mold and rust.
- Store in a cool, dry place to avoid moisture and temperature extremes.
- For long-term storage, cover chairs with dust covers or wrap them in plastic to keep out dust and grime.
- Apply lubricant to the hinges and joints every so often to keep them opening and closing smoothly.
- Check on stored chairs regularly to ensure they stay in good condition, free from moisture or pests.
- Keep the storage area's humidity between 30% and 40% to help protect the chairs over time.
- Limit direct sunlight and extreme temperatures to preserve the chairs' quality and appearance.



STEEL

CLEANING

Dip a soft cloth or sponge in warm, soapy water, wring it out, and wipe down the entire chair—seat, backrest, and legs.

STAIN REMOVAL

For tough stains, gently scrub with a soft-bristle brush. To prevent rust, apply a thin layer of car wax or metal protectant to any steel parts; this adds a barrier against moisture.

DRYING

Thoroughly dry the chairs with a towel to avoid water spots and rust. Let them air dry completely in a well-ventilated area before storing or using.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid abrasive cleaners or steel wool, as these can scratch and damage the steel surface.



VINYL UPHOLSTERY

CLEANING

Dip a soft cloth or sponge in warm, soapy water and gently scrub the vinyl upholstery, focusing on stained or soiled spots. Avoid using too much water, as vinyl can be sensitive to moisture.

STAIN REMOVAL

For tougher stains, make a paste with baking soda and water. Apply it to the stain and gently scrub with a soft brush or cloth.

DRYING

Pat the vinyl dry with a towel. To keep it from drying out or cracking, consider using a vinyl conditioner or protectant.

WHAT TO AVOID

Skip heat sources like hair dryers or heaters, as high heat can damage vinyl.



PLASTIC

CLEANING

Dip a sponge or soft brush in warm, soapy water and scrub the plastic chairs thoroughly, focusing on any stained or grimy spots.

STAIN REMOVAL

For stubborn stains or mildew, use a mix of equal parts water and white vinegar. Apply to the area, let it sit for a few minutes, then scrub and rinse.

DRYING

Whenever possible, let the chairs dry in sunlight—this helps naturally disinfect and deodorize the plastic.

WHAT TO AVOID

Skip abrasive cleaners like scouring powders or steel wool, as they can scratch and dull the plastic.



FABRIC UPHOLSTERY

CLEANING

Start by vacuuming the upholstery to remove loose dirt and dust. Use a soft brush attachment or handheld vacuum with a brush nozzle for gentle cleaning.

STAIN REMOVAL

For a deeper clean, lightly dampen a sponge or microfiber cloth with cleaning solution (not too wet) and wipe each area in sections. Avoid metal parts like buttons and legs to prevent rust.

DRYING

Thoroughly dry the chairs with a towel to prevent water spots and rust. Let them air dry completely in a well-ventilated area before storing or using.
