Stages & Risers – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

Our Stages & Risers are built to last, and with a little help from you, they will stay strong and clean for years to come. Here are some tips:

- Preserve its condition by keeping the relative humidity level in the environment between 30% and 40%.
- Place it away from heat sources such as radiators, heating vents, and wood-burning stoves.
- Shield your furniture from direct sunlight exposure and extreme temperatures to keep the finish pristine.
- Place protective mats or carpets on high-traffic areas to minimize wear.
- Use a damp cloth with mild soap to clean the surfaces.
- Use a soft broom, vacuum cleaner, or microfiber cloth to remove dust and debris after every use.
- Lift and move heavy objects instead of dragging them to prevent scratches or gouges.
- Avoid abrasive cleaners or solvents that can damage finishes or cause discoloration.
- Use dust covers or tarps to shield from dirt and moisture.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Regularly clean the surface with a gentle cleaning solution to prevent the buildup of dirt and grime. Promptly clean up any spills to prevent staining.

KEY CLEANING SOLUTIONS

- Create a solution using a mild dish soap and warm water, and with a damp cloth, wipe off any marks.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- After cleaning, use a dry, clean cloth to wipe the surface dry thoroughly. Ensure that no water is left on the surface to prevent damage.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using harsh cleaners or abrasives on the powder-coated steel surface. These can damage the finish and cause it to fade or chip. Also, extreme temperatures can damage the finish and make it more susceptible to chipping and cracking.



Carpet

Always test a new cleaning product in an inconspicuous area to ensure it is safe to use.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Regularly vacuum the carpeted surface to remove dirt and debris. Promptly blot spills with a clean cloth to prevent stains.

STAIN REMOVAL

- Use a solution of mild dish soap and warm water for spot cleaning. Apply gently with a soft cloth or sponge and blot the area.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- After cleaning, press a dry towel onto the carpet to absorb excess moisture. Allow the area to air dry completely to prevent mildew.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using bleach or strong chemical cleaners, as they can damage fibers and discolor the carpet. Also, avoid excessive water, which can soak the padding and lead to mold growth.



Plywood

KEY CLEANING SOLUTIONS

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- After cleaning, use a dry soft cloth to wipe down the table, removing any remaining moisture. This helps prevent water damage or warping of the plywood.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using excessive water or soaking the plywood, as it can lead to warping or damage. Also, don't use abrasive cleaners or scrubbers, as they can scratch and damage the wood surface.

STAIN REMOVAL

- For stubborn stains, you can use a soft brush dipped in the soapy water to gently scrub the affected area. Be gentle to avoid scratching the wood.

EXTRA CARE

- Optionally, you can apply a furniture polish or wood conditioner to protect and enhance the appearance of the plywood.
